Lynn Hewitt

Lynn Hewitt has been making quilts for 28 years and teaching patchwork and quilting for 26 years. She joined The Quilters' Guild of NSW in 1990 and has entered quilts in the Sydney Quilt Show every year since 1991. She joined the Guild Committee in 1995 as Sponsorship and Publicity officer and has been on various sub-committees ever since. Lynn was President from 1999 to 2002 when it was decided to change the name to The Quilters' Guild of NSW Inc. She was President again from 2005 to 2006.

At present, Lynn is on the Teacher Accreditation, Valuation and Judging sub-committees of QuiltNSW. She has judged 28 quilt shows, including country quilt shows in NSW as well as major quilt shows in Sydney, Canberra, Brisbane and Darwin. Lynn is an Accredited Teacher and she teaches regular 'Anything Goes' classes at a local patchwork shop as well as workshops with groups in country NSW.

Another of her favourite activities is leading Quilters' Tours overseas. Lynn has led one to Houston and five to Japan. The Japanese tours focus on textile related activities and visits to a Japanese quilting group and, in the past, the Yokohama Quilt Show. These frequent trips to Japan have influenced Lynn's recent works, and she enjoys exploring new techniques which she likes to share with her students.

At the recently held Australasian Quilt Convention in Melbourne, Lynn was presented with the Rajah Award; this Award acknowledges an outstanding contribution to quilting in Australia.

"Japanese Traditions": Completed 2012 (139 x 200 cm)

Sashiko blocks designed by Hitomi Fujita are combined with a Japanese fabric featuring a traditional landscape. Machine appliqué is used to 'blur' the seams between the blocks, creating a continuous landscape. Machine pieced and quilted, hand stitched and hand quilted. Quilt completed in 8 weeks, July to August, 2012 for inclusion in Down Under Quilts Magazine.

Jan Foster

Jan lives on the Central Coast of NSW. She is a former Visual Arts Teacher and for the past 14 years has poured her creativity into longarm quilting. Jan quilts on a hand-guided Gammill for most of her custom quilting and also uses a computerised Gammill to complete Edge to Edge quilting for customers' quilts.

Jan absolutely loves what she does - completing customers' quilts as well as her own. She loves the texture and pattern that the quilting design brings to a quilt top. Jan admits to being a bit obsessive about quilting things well and ensuring that the quilting complements the quilt top and not dominate it.

Jan also enjoys teaching domestic machine quilting locally and in Newcastle. She feels a great sense of satisfaction being able to pass her quilting knowledge on to quilters who are passionate about completing their own work all by themselves.

"Lollipop": Completed 2017 (200 x 200 cm)

I had a lot of fun collecting the brights for this project. I love 'drunkards path' and decided to try out the 'drunkards path' rulers from Victorian Textiles. This is a long time UFO glad to be finished. It has been custom quilted with a combination of freehand and computerised designs.

Beth Miller

Beth has lived in Canberra, Australia's capital city since 1975, but spent her formative years in Darwin, Northern Territory. The 1974 cyclone which devastated Darwin made the decision to relocate to Canberra via Alice Springs very easy.

Beth didn't have a sewing background as the hot humid weather of the Northern Territory didn't lend itself to working with a needle and thread. It wasn't until she was in her mid-twenties that Beth decided to enrol in a dressmaking course.

Beth attempted to make a quilt on her own but her real introduction to patchwork occurred when she attended a beginner class in 1981. Over time she has tried many techniques but favours the freedom of contemporary piecing and fused appliqué. What started out as a hobby has become a passion and has given Beth the opportunity to travel and meet many wonderful people from all over the world.

In 1997 Beth completed Tertiary studies in commercial screen printing, fabric decoration and printing. It was during that period that she started to make art quilts and print, paint and dye many of the fabrics that she uses in

her work. Beth's other passion is photography and she uses her photographs as a design source. Sometimes she may only use a single photograph and at other times she may collage several photographs to create the design. Most of Beth's work is based upon the technique of fused appliqué and machine quilting. In many cases she enhances her work with hand embroidery or hand stitching.

Beth's work has been juried into many selected exhibitions both nationally and internationally and she has won awards in both Australia and the USA. She is one of the six Canberra based artists of the tACTile group comprising of Jenny Bowker, Dianne Firth, Helen Gray, Beth Miller and Beth and Trevor Reid working in partnership. The tACTile group has been exhibiting their work both nationally and internationally for the last fourteen years.

Beth has been teaching patchwork classes to adults and children since 1991 within Australia and also internationally concentrating upon colour, design, appliqué and contemporary piecing. She has found teaching to be very rewarding; "to be able to introduce ideas and techniques to students so that they could express themselves in a creative manner was very satisfying". In 2010 Beth decided to retire from teaching to concentrate upon her art quilts and spend more time with her family.

In 2016 Beth was selected to be the recipient of the prestigious Rajah Award sponsored by Expertise Events for outstanding contribution to Australian Quilting.

"Bayon Temple": Completed 2016 (102 x 151 cm)

The Bayon Temple was thought to be built in the late 12th Century by the Khmer King Jayavarman VII. The most distinctive features of the Bayon complex are the massive serene stone faces carved on the four sides of the towers and the bas relief carvings depicting everyday scenes. I was amazed at how the faces and carvings created a sense of awe and presence even though they had been exposed to the elements and neglect over the last seven centuries.

Carolyn Sullivan

Carolyn lives just outside Bundanoon on five acres of flat, plateau country surrounded by eucalypt and deciduous trees in a park like site. Its cool climate, many gardens, closeness to the escarpment and beautiful mists, provided lots of inspiration for her work. Living on a large expanse of land has meant that she has a closer involvement with the natural features. It also enables her to thoroughly investigate the smaller things that are here – the leaves, deciduous, conifer and eucalypt; the tracks left by insects on tree trunks and on the ground; the lichens; the fungi; the grasses; the birds; and the mists, sleet and storms of the cold climate.

Carolyn's journeys away from home also presents opportunities to observe, draw, interpret and incorporate new ideas into her works. An 8,000km-driving trip to Central Australia in 2013 and a return trip in 2016 have provided a lot of inspiration for new work. "I have seen the desert in bloom and rare moments like these are a gift in a land that is often harsh and confronting".

Hand stitching is what she loves to do. Indian kanthas and the tradition of close, straight stitches have formed the majority of her work, however, she is also interested in finding other ways of stitching that expresses what she sees. She covers large expanses of her own plant dyed cloth with stitching that describes the vastness of the Australian landscape.

Carolyn has been a member of QuiltNSW since 1991 and served on the Valuation committee for a short time before becoming Vice President in 1994, then President in 1995-6. She was honoured to become a Life Member some years ago but since moving to Bundanoon in 2004, most of her involvement with QuiltNSW has been the annual Quilt Show.

In the last 10 years Carolyn has been involved with Ozquilt Network, exhibiting with their Australia Wide collections and finding exhibition opportunities through the newsletter that the organisation offers.

Carolyn's most pleasing achievement has been to have quilts accepted into general art exhibitions at Stanthorpe Regional Gallery and at Goulburn Regional Gallery, each on two occasions. "Stanthorpe Gallery has one of my works in their collection".

She has written five books, three of which show the sources of inspiration, drawing and artworks made from those sources and finished works. They can be purchased through Blurb.

- 1. "Returning" 2014, 136 x 117 cm. I was invited to contribute to the 'Labours of Love' exhibition at Hazelhurst Gallery and Art Centre in 2015. I lived for almost 50 years in the Sutherland Shire before moving to Bundanoon in 2004 and this quilt was meant to represent growing up there the bush, the birds, the flowering gum trees, and the freedom to run wild, all in a newly built suburb.
- 2. "Three Views" 2011, 107 x 79 cm. This was included in 'Regeneration' at Manly Art Gallery and was about regeneration of the bush after clearing.
- 3. "Flowering Red Gums" 2012, 117 x 99 cm. This quilt was all about the wide expanse of the undulating land extending from our home acreage to the escarpment and the coast. The flowers of the Australian bush are part of that view and inspire my work.
- 4. "Distant" 2014, 116 x 101 cm.
 After a long drive to Central Australia in 2013 and back I had been amazed at the growth of flowers after rain
- 5. "One Jumped" 2015, 148 x 89 cm.
 This is a continuing response to the flowers of the
- **6.** "Mushroom" 2010, 140×92 cm. Looking at the undersides of the mushrooms that grow wild on our property. This quilt was included in Quilt National 2011.
- 7. "Roadside Coreopsis" 2010, 135 x 97 cm. The bright cheery lines of coreopsis flowers along the road are a seasonal view of where I live.

- 8. "Driving In" 2013, 158 x 106 cm. This quilt was about my drive into Canberra, made for the centennial of Canberra exhibition held by Ozquilt Network at Craft ACT in 2013. I was highlighting the many images of one place that can be seen when 'driving in'.
- 9. "Remnants" 2009, 130 x 75 cm.
 The landscape varies from the particular to the expansive from insect tracks in a log to the undulations of the land. This quilt was in the New Quilt at Manly Art Gallery in 2009.
- **10. "Bark Lines"** 2009, 75 x 82 cm. Tracing the lines of bark on one of the trees on our property.
- **11. "Frivolous"** 2011, 60 x 60 cm. My interpretation of a postcard of a Yugoslavian embroidery. Made just for the fun of stitching.
- **12. "Abundance"** 2013, 60 x 60 cm. Another work based on cultural embroidery.
- **13. "Other Places"** 2015, 94 x 70 cm. A series of embroideries based on cultural embroideries
- **14. "Signature XIII"** 2007, 50 x 54 cm. This quilt shows the scribbly gum markings from our property.
- **15. "Red Mallee Leaves"** 2008, 47 x 47 cm. Made after a trip to Mungo National Park, using the leaf shapes of the mallee trees and showing the openness of the desert.
- **16. "Eucalypt"** 2010, 50 x 50 cm. Reflecting colours and images of home.

Rhonda Pearce

Rhonda's professional life began at the age of fifteen with an apprenticeship as a dressmaker in an `Haute Couture' fashion house in Sydney called Germaine Rocher. She followed this with a twenty-five year business of her own as a dressmaker, making formal gowns and many more wedding dresses than she cares to count. She caught the patchwork bug in the nineties and it took over her life, ending her dressmaking career.

Following a trip to the U.S.A. with Val Moore, Rhonda came home all inspired and in 1997, opened a patchwork shop in the old post office at Glenbrook in the Blue Mountains of New South Wales called 'Post Office Patchwork'. She held many classes for adults and children and found this very rewarding. Over the years she made many new friends.

Over the ensuing years Rhonda developed many patterns and produced numerous outstanding quilts, including First Place in The Quilters' Guild of NSW's 'Professional, Traditional and Viewers' Choice 2007' category for her 'Insanity' quilt, which has attracted a huge following, both in Australia and overseas.

After selling the business in 2014, Rhonda continued to teach classes at Post Office Patchwork, Patchwork Plus and other places. Over the years she has entered many quilts in the Sydney Quilt Show and has been lucky enough to win some awards.

Rhonda's highlight so far was winning a blue ribbon in the traditional appliqué section at the Houston Quilt Show, U.S.A. in 2013. It was in Hawaii on her way home that Rhonda found out she also won the Viewers' Choice award. Much celebration was enjoyed with her friends.

- 1. "Elsie May" 2016, 140 x 158 cm. This is an original design including basic pieced blocks. This quilt has been hand pieced, hand appliquéd and hand quilted.
- 2. "Monique's Mosaics" 2016, 250 x 286 cm This design was inspired by a trip to Italy and a picture a friend showed me. Paper pieced and hand quilted. I made this quilt for my granddaughter for her 21st birthday.
- 3. "A Tribute to Anne" 2015, 245 x 295 cm The original quilt is hanging in the Victoria and Albert museum in London. I fell in love with the Ann Randoll Coverlet when it toured in Brisbane. This is my version which was drawn up by me. It is hand pieced and hand quilted.
- 4. "Glenbrook Star" 2015, 200 x 200 cm This is an original design. Foundation pieced and hand appliquéd. Machine quilted by David Hansor, Moss Vale
- 5. "Red Birds" 2014, 150 x 150 cm This is an original design. Foundation pieced and hand appliquéd. It was machine quilted by David Hansor. Moss Vale.

- **6. "Dear Jane"** 2014, 206 x 206 cm Everyone loves to make a Dear Jane. Foundation pieced and hand guilted.
- 7. "Classic Baltimore" 2012, 270 x 270 cm
 The original quilt is hanging in The American
 Museum in Bath, England. I drew up all the blocks
 which are hand pieced and hand quilted. This quilt
 won a blue ribbon in the Traditional Appliqué
 category & Viewers' Choice in Houston U.S.A. in
 2013.
- **8. "Insanity"** 2007, 195 x 212 cm
 This is my most famous quilt. It is an original design which has been paper pieced and hand quilted. Insanity has its own Facebook page and has a following around the world.
- 9. "My Patchwork Journey" 2001, 220 x 220 cm My second appliqué quilt. It was started in a class with Susan Harris. I used Elly Sienkiewicz's feather border. It is hand quilted with trapunto.
- 10. "For my Child" 1995, 202 x 263 cm My first appliqué quilt. It was designed by Jeana Kimball and her quilt was called Bride of Tulip Valley. This quilt was quilted and made for my daughter Lee for her 21st birthday.

Pennant Hills, NSW 165 x 124 cm

Art Quilt

I wanted to use what I considered 'urban' colours and experiment with different techniques learnt over the years. Loved using Flying Geese and Half Square Triangles, and sliced and diced some blocks that I didn't feel worked well as they were.

5. Shelley Kelly "Starstruck"

Barnawartha, VIC. 48 x 48 cm Miniature

"Star Struck" was inspired by a picture of an antique compass, which is the centre and then surrounded by smaller compasses. I have learnt many lessons along the way making miniatures, but I am always up for a new challenge every year. So enjoyable!

6. Susan Reinhard "Devoted to Hexies" Budgee Budgee, NSW 30 x 26 cm Miniature

I resisted 1/4" hexagons for so long, knowing full well that resistance was futile. Such small fussy cutting was a time consuming but satisfying task, and a great opportunity to make the most of some favourite small prints.

7. Jane Gibson

Epping, NSW 12 x 12 cm Miniature

Playing with Log Cabin again and using 'big' fabric as cheater cloth for a miniature. The possibilities are endless.

8. Judi Nikoleski

Charlestown, NSW 17 x 23 cm

"Sea Shades: Rainbow Darts & Broody

Miniature

Inspired by the muted colours of the sea, the flash and sparkle of fish. Spot alued raw edge appliqué enables experimentation with accumulated small fabric scraps, bamboo towelling. Finished with free machine guilting. with sheer, embroidery and beading.

9. Karen Robertson "Copse of Birch"

Windsor Downs, NSW 27 x 13 cm Miniature

This is my first attempt at art quilting. The idea came about due to some personal issues occurring in my life. I find when I'm stressed, a walk in the bush is a healthy antidote and as it happens Birch are one of my favourite

10. Felicity Scott "It's Been a Bard Year" Miranda, NSW 30 x 30 cm

Miniature

A small tribute to the great man using a mixed bag of hand work: painting, calligraphy, drawing, embroidery, appliqué, and yes - hand quilting.

11. Felicity Scott "Coming Home"

Miranda, NSW 35 x 35 cm Miniature

Originally made in icing for a 90th birthday, this is hardly a miniature family tree! Hand painted. appliquéd, embroidered and quilted; with the border design inspired by the lead light windows of the family home

12. Linda Crouch

"Whirlygia"

Doncaster, VIC 48 x 48 cm

Miniature I love the shape and swirl of this design which I found on the Internet. I drew the centre design on the fabric and added my own design to the outer part of the guilt. I used two layers of Hobbs polydown wadding, and guilted in monochromatic colours.

13. Robyn Cuthbertson "Purple Nights"

Lower Plenty, VIC 38 x 52 cm

Miniature

This guilt was a bit of a happy accident. I had a number of different ideas I wanted to try out; new threads, using different colours, a new design idea, new edging techniques (thanks Bethanne Nemesh!). The result was one of my favourite pieces!

16 Julio Pearras "Migrations End"

Drouin, VIC 74 x 62 cm

Other Techniques - Professional

I purchased this vintage textile with the intent of guilting it for my daughter, who shares the same initials. The migratory hummingbird fittingly symbolises the long journey this antique French textile has made to get to its final destination.

17. Prunella Noonan "Flight Over the Bungles"

Avalon, NSW 55 x 50 cm Pictorial Quilt

I had the great privilege to work in the Kimberley and at the end of my time there I was treated to a flight over the Bungles. I took a photo from the plane window and the wonderful colours of the rock formation and the deep chasms inspired this work.

18. Tvarn Harris "Safari Escape

Junction Hill, NSW 88 x 63 cm

Junior Member B (Year 7-12): 18 years

Background hand painted using Genesis Dyes. Fabric graffiti for foreground. Three dimensional leaves and cloud, embellished elephant and giraffe. Hand and machine appliqué. Machine quilted.

19. Elaine Raahauge "Born Again Feathered Star" Epping, NSW 85 x 85 cm

Pieced Quilt, predominantly hand quilted - Amateur Foundation piecing of this traditional design (Feathered Star) allows the small pieces and sharp points to shine. Light and dark fabrics provide contrast and the agua gives it zing.

20. Kay Haerland

Green Point NSW 60 x 59 cm

Art Quilt

This guilt was made using ochre and different powdered soils to form the shapes. Monofilament thread was used for guilting to create texture without adding colour. It was great fun to see it come to life.

21. Catherine Babidge "Birdseye View"

Paddington, NSW 85 x 85 cm Art Quilt

Joe Cunningham, @ioethequilter, teaches an improv block technique called 'Rock the Block'. I did an online tutorial and tried the technique with Valerie Wells fabric 'Marks'. The result is this bird.

22. Pam Russell "Salamanca Shadows" Concord West, NSW 39 x 57 cm Pictorial Quilt

Taken from a photograph by my husband during our recent trip to Tasmania. I hand dyed most of the fabrics to get the range of colours required.

23. Ele Hockey

Barrack Heights, NSW 86 x 84 cm

"Flowers" Pieced Quilt, predominantly machine guilted -Amateur

The leaves are pieced with appliqué diamonds in the border. Raw edge appliqué was added to the flowers and ombre fabric was used for the diamonds. The quilting was freehand.

24. Keiko Arita "Haiku Frog"

Lalor Park, NSW 44 x 52 cm

Other Techniques - Amateur

The haiku was made by Matsuo Basho (1644-1694). An English translation by Donald Keene: The ancient pond

A frog leaps in The sound of water.

25. Susan Lindsay Ermington, NSW "Uluru - Silent, Starry, Starry Nights & 90 x 80 cm Land of the Rainbow Gold'

Other Techniques - Amateur

I went to a Carolyn Sharkey Retreat at Uluru, and used two of Carolyn's machine embroidered pictures I purchased and fabric of my own to make a pictorial wallhanging as a memory of my experience at Uluru.

26. Janet Browne "Goi's Vase #1"

Illawong, NSW 50 x 50 cm

Other Techniques - Amateur

Goi loved her blue vase, filled with flowers from her garden. Cotton, polyester, rayon threads; cotton, silk, satin, linen, chiffon fabrics; hand painted, dved & commercial; pens, pencils; machine appliqué, quilting, thread painting, hand embroidery.

27. Amanda Daly "Organically Grown" Kenthurst, NSW 80 x 80 cm

Other Techniques - Professional

I make a lot of fantasy flowers and the 3 Dimensional aspect is something I developed to add texture and interest

28. Bernice Krige

"Forest Wonders"

Baulkham Hills, NSW 51 x 51 cm

Coverlet

A 40 year old piece of French linen, my daughter's love of purple and the magical world of mushrooms inspired my "Forest Wonders" cushion cover.

29. Carolynne Gordon

"Encroachment

Rozelle, NSW 97 x 94 cm

Other Techniques - Amateur

"Encroachment" explores the invasion of forces. whether it's suffocation of the natural world, or human spirit through political oppression. I've manipulated fabric and thread scraps, and heavily matchstick quilted over a layer of netting.

30. Julie White "Wind Power"

North Turramurra, NSW 70 x 70 cm Pictorial Quilt

"Wind Power" is my original design from two photos taken in 1985 of the Kinderdijk (Holland). I entered it in the 2015 Brother International Competition where it was in the Top 10. The sky is hand painted and all appliquéd and machine embellished.

31. Pamela Curtis "Taking Another Path" Five Dock, NSW 52 x 64 cm Art Quilt

This piece was started at AQC Melbourne with Rosalie Dace. The Thinking Eye, a class inspired by the work of Klee (1879-1940).

32. Kiyo Inoue "Treasure Chest" Tokyo, Japan 85 x 85 cm

Combined Pieced & Appliqué Quilt - Amateur There are many, many colours in my treasure chest. I made my "Treasure Chest" to use them. I have enjoyed very much, playing colours and making this guilt design.

33. Susan McGrory

"Morning Prayers"

Lurnea, NSW 52 x 64 cm

Pictorial Quilt

"Morning Prayers" was a design I decided on following a movie I had seen many years ago. I drew it out onto my fabric, then hand painted it and then thread painted it. Finally finished the guilt with free motion guilting.

34. Julie Adamson ".lessie"

Mill Park, VIC. 91 v 85 cm

Appliqué Quilt - Professional

"Jessie" is my interpretation of the traditional designs historically used in home furnishings, wall paper and damask fabrics. All appliqué pieces are from the one piece of batik. Hand needletum appliquéd and freehand hand quilted.

35. Pam Furniss

"Butterfly Star Surprise"

Green Point, NSW 87 x 89 cm Appliqué Quilt - Professional

"Butterfly Star Surprise" is set on point and made completely by machine. Quilt as you sew, using decorative stitches. Dimensional butterflies appliquéd to completed blocks.

36. Salley Govey "Diaper 1 - Red and Ecru" Spit Junction, NSW 87 x 97 cm Coverlet

Created purely as an exercise in design and colour. Showing how with exploration of the hexagon shape via colour placement, rather than the block being central to design a visually dynamic pattern can be achieved once colour decisions are controlled.

37. Judith Thomson "Liberty Belle"

Bega, NSW 72 x 88 cm Pictorial Quilt

"Belle" was created to raise awareness that animals do not deserve the suffering inherent in the live animal export trade. She is collaged almost entirely from Liberty fabric and machine appliquéd. Based on my photograph of the lovely 'Lammie'.

38. Nancy Parkinson "Poppies"

Helensburgh, NSW 70 x 90 cm

Appliqué Quilt - Amateur Machine appliqué class with Mary Transom of New

Zealand, have just finished it after leaving the wall hanging lying dormant for a few years. Design Source: Workshop by Mary Transom



39. Marilyn Lowder "Native Flower Wreath" Engadine, NSW 65 x 74 cm

Appliqué Quilt - Professional

This is a sample for my classes on dimensional flowers. It shows examples of using ruching, Suffolk puffs, faced appliqué and beading to represent Australian native flowers

Other Techniques - Amateur

Australia has unique trees. This guilt showcases the interesting stages of leaf development of the Australian Illawarra Flame Tree. I was fascinated by how dramatically the shape of the leaves changed from juvenile to mature.

42. Margaret Millar "Spirits of the Forest" Parramatta, NSW

55 x 80 cm Art Quilt

This guilt combines my love of ghost gum trees and experiments with a stitch and slash construction technique. It has five layers of different fabric and machine embroidery on the top. Ghostly figures evoke the 'voices' of the spirits of the forest.

43. Judith Rona

Bondi, NSW "Next Year in Jerusalem" 90 x 93 cm

Pieced Quilt, predominantly machine guilted -

. Amateur Four sons, four questions, four cups of wine - it must be Passover. My Rods and Quads piecing technique with curves.

44. Sue de Vanny

Greenvale VIC 114 x 77 cm

Pictorial Quilt "Paris" is a fabric collage of our beloved Cavalier King Charles' face done in memorandum; using a photo of her a couple of years before she passed away. The funny little blue flowers guilted in the background represent one flower one year of her life.

45. Linda Crouch "Spring Fling"

Doncaster, VIC. 91 x 91 cm Pictorial Quilt

A Kangaroo Paw flowering on my deck last spring inspired this quilt. I love the bright colours of this particular variety. I used images of Australian wildflowers and the bark of a Scribbly Gum tree as the inspiration for the free motion guilting.

46. Robyn Eves "I Spy a Seahorse" Woronora, NSW $90 \times 90 \text{ cm}$ Art Quilt

The Sydney Seahorse (Hippocampus Whitei), a master

of disquise, uses its shape, colour and skin texture to hide in its leafy surrounds. This piece is inspired by a photograph by my husband (permission granted) on a dive we did in Sydney Harbour.

47. Linda Steele "On the Prowl"

Park Orchards, VIC 108 x 71 cm Pictorial Quilt

Lion fish lurk deep in the caves of the coral reef and wait to catch their prey with their poisonous spines.

48. Ele Hockey Barrack Heights, NSW "Torrap (parrot spelt backwards) 90 x 90 cm

Other Techniques - Amateur

The leaves and parrot were painted on a calico background. I used raw edge stitching for the leaves on the parrot and appliqué was applied as well. White embroidery thread was painted yellow to give a 3D appearance.

49. Amanda Dalv Kenthurst, NSW "Old Gum Tree" 50 x 75 cm Pictorial Quilt

Kookaburras sit in the gum trees in the bush around our home and I photograph them from every angle. A student asked me to make a wall hanging with a Kookaburra theme as a project for a workshop and I was happy to oblige.

Engadine, NSW 50 Gail Sadleir "Dawn" 96 x 96 cm Art Quilt

When I returned from a cruise, we sailed into the harbour at dawn. I was struck by the light on the buildings and the general atmosphere. I loved the scene and have recreated my feelings and interpretations of the scene.

51. Robyn Eves Woronora NSW "Leaf Litter 3" 40 x 80 cm Art Quilt

An original design. Ideas, thoughts and images from personal observations, a photograph by Ruth Rankin, (permission granted) and a techniques class with Sue Hotchkis.

Maryborough, VIC 52. Jenny Bacon "Wattle" 96 x 98 cm

Modern

Inspired by the Golden Wattle that blooms in the forests around my home at the end of winter, a real harbinger of spring.

53. Isabella Klompe Double Bay, NSW "Whiteout" 70 v 91 cm Pictorial Quilt

This quilt has many layers. The black/white has 3 layers and is quilted in red, then the lattice is applied and guilted, and last is flowers and vase which is raw edge appliqué. This gives a sense that the vase and flowers are floating on top of the guilt.

Bundanoon, NSW 54. Carolyn Sullivan 142 v 83 cm "Affinity 2" Art Quilt

My views of the Australian desert.

55. Carolynne Gordon Rozelle, NSW 78 x 78 cm "Ombre"

Art Quilt

"Ombre" is an abstract exploration of colour. I have flipped some sections, so the underside is the top. It has been a slow-grow. A lot of experimenting, pulling apart, putting together again, a few times over. Finally, it's settled into place.

56. Catherine Babidge Paddington, NSW "Industrial Landscape" 67 x 94 cm Art Quilt

In this improvisational piece using solid colours and a black and white stripe, I have let the fabrics tell the story... only towards the end did I see a picture emerging

Kirrawee, NSW 57. Kathy Wood "Nursery Friends" 71 x 99 cm

Appliqué Quilt - Amateur

This guilt was made for my fifth grandchild. I have always loved William Morris designs and Michele Hill's interpretation. I have quilted this myself following classes with Deb Louie who gave me the confidence to

I visited France in Spring and had the last snowfall that covered an area where I walked. The little church was some distance away and in French was written "St Ann Blessing the Traveller". It was also part of a dream that I subsequently had.

60. Denise Sargo South Hurstville, NSW "Meerkat" 70 x 110 cm

Other Techniques - Amateur

A needle felted meerkat on a silk voile background with light embroidery to keep layers together. Eco dyed and rusted fabrics were used for border to contrast with the silk and wool.

61. Kathy Thorncraft Homebush, NSW "Danger Ahead" 116 x 101 cm Modern

This quilt uses Kona Highlight (Kona colour of the year 2016) combined with different black, grey and white fabrics that have a hand drawn sketch look. I set myself the challenge of using narrow strips and drew inspiration from all things Hi-Vis!

62. Deborah Louie Oyster Bay, NSW "Glamorous Clams" 86 x 104 cm

Other Techniques - Professional

"Glamorous Clams" was made to take my students and their machines to new heights. We rarely experiment with the decorative embroidery stitches on our machines. Now a skill building book is available through my website.

63. Kay Haerland Green Point, NSW "Cardinal Event" 140 x 100 cm Pictorial Quilt

"Cardinal Event" shows a very fond memory from our winters in Pennsylvania, USA. It shows the view from our kitchen window after a snowfall, when these beautiful Cardinal birds flocked to our bird feeders.

Wakerley, QLD 64 Jane Rundle 50 x 99 cm "G is for Green" Art

Improvisational piecing, a fun play with letters. A monochromatic piece with a little whimsy!

Scone, NSW 65 Tonia Barton "Fantastic Fusion Meets Classic Quilting" 97 x 130 cm Other Techniques - Amateur

At the Misty Mountain Retreat I did two great workshops. One with the fantastic Lisa Walton, whose enthusiasm for fabric was infectious, and the second with Bev McClune, who gave a wonderful insight into domestic quilting.

Wholecloth, giclée print (own photograph) on tissue thin silk, trapunto, metallic free motion embroidery, intensive guilting with 100wt ultra fine threads, metal foil. I took this shot in the Yarra Valley (Vic) with wonderful model Shay Jellick.

69. Trudy Johns The Junction, NSW "Hip Hop 53 x 85 cm

Appliqué Quilt - Professional A fun quilt to do with all the beautiful florals available to buy. It was a real challenge to get the body of the rabbit shading where muscle would be. Design Source: Hip Hop Rabbit Collage by Laura Heine

70. Anna Brown Bungwahl, NSW 137 x 103 cm "Flora Canopy 2" Art Quilt

The inspiration for this guilt came from the patterns of light and shade seen through a canopy of eucalyptus trees.

71. Judy Day Lindfield, NSW "Eveline's Posies" 102 x 104 cm Appliqué Quilt - Professional

I used a pattern for the posy design by Mieke Duyck (Quiltmania, No 111). The original design by Eveline Foland was published in the Kansas City Star in 1929. Blocks hand appliquéd using a 5-inch charm pack of Moda's Modernism range. Hand guilted. Design Source: Posey Quilt by Mieke Duyck

72. Julie Woods Goulburn, NSW "The Six Locked Secret Dreams" 107 x 104 cm

Pieced Quilt - Professional

Curved foundation piecing was used to piece this guilt. It was a challenge I enjoyed but took much longer to piece than expected. I enjoyed the challenge I gave myself with this guilt and was pleased with the end

73. Jenny Bacon Maryborough, VIC "Crabapple Jelly" 105 x 105 cm

Combined Pieced & Appliqué Quilt - Professional Traditional Orange Peel design adapted and added to with appliqué border, colours inspired by the crabapple tree in my garden that flowers in abundance every spring.

74. Nancy Parkinson Helensburgh, NSW "Night Life" 106 x 106 cm

Appliqué Quilt - Amateur

I found this design in the Japanese magazine Tsushin 1999 and decided that one day I would make the wall hanging. It took 15 years of contemplation and finally in 2016 I began work on it. All instructions were in Japanese which I do not understand!

Blocks printed from painted pottery bowls of the Mimbres people of New Mexico. They were created between 1000 and 1150AD. These people vanished around 1300AD, leaving ruined villages and pottery bowls. Memories of our travels in the area.

This quilt was made in a challenge group. Each month the colour and additional requirement was changed. It was amazing how differently each month's requirement was decided by participants. Machine pieced, quilt-asvou-ao technique.

100. Karen Malone Beecroft, NSW "Hidden Pathway" 121 x 121 cm Modern

This maze was fun to draw and sew! There is a pathway between the entry and exit openings. Because of lots of interest in a previous maze, I used this smaller one as a basis for a pattern I am releasing.

Waitara, NSW 101. Jennifer Davis "Intersectionality" 109 x 116 cm

Pieced Quilt, predominantly machine guilted -Amateur

"Intersectionality" is a feminist guilt. If my feminism doesn't include women from outside my own experiences, my feminism is garbage. Intersections are essential. I designed this guilt to draw the eye to those intersections, using colour as a proxy.

Wall hanging with Balinese jelly roll fabrics and wax

I wanted to capture these daisies from a garden I visited in a painterly way, that made them look fresh and carefree in the warm sunshine.

130 x 130 cm Pieced Quilt - Professional

This quilt was made for the Southern Cross Quilters' Four-Patch challenge. Machine pieced and free motion guilted on my domestic machine with modern prints from my stash.

Pieced Quilt, predominantly hand quilted - Amateur A weekend away with a bag of scraps and a good friend was the perfect setting for creating this guilt full of dancing guys and dolls...at least to me!

203. Marissa Rennie Belrose, NSW "I Spy" 175 x 177 cm

Combined Pieced & Appliqué Quilt - Amateur Modern twist on Chuck Nohara designs using my favoured brights and bolds. Taught by Lorena Uriate. Taught to look in to depth of a design and how to decide on which techniques to apply: appliqué, English paper piecing and foundation piecing.

Pieced Quilt, predominantly machine quilted -**Á**mateur

"Fan Girl" is a guilt using some of my most hoarded fabric. I originally designed this guilt using other fabrics and it looked very different. Once I decided on the centre panel then the design evolved and I cut deeper into my stash!

206. Makayla Laurie Grafton, NSW "The Jewel Star 178 x 178 cm

Junior Member B (Year 7-12; 17 years)

Criss-cross design created to form subtle stars using green and blue fabrics on a pink background. Machine guilted by myself on a longarm guilting machine.

207. Joy Herbert & Maxine Sandry Bangalee, NSW 178 x 174 cm "I ime Fizz" Two Person Collaborative Quilt

"Lime Fizz" was inspired by Jess Frost's quilt "Misdirection" which was displayed at AQC 2015. It is made of half-rectangle-triangles and rectangles. The chevron design was easier than first expected but not as easy as half-square-triangles?? Design Source: Design by Jess Frost

208. Karen Terrens Northcote, VIC "Cornflower Blue" 176 x 176 cm

Other Techniques - Professional

"Cornflower Blue" is a Diamond Sawtooth quilt - a traditional Amish design. Feathers have been guilted to fill the space. A double layer of wadding has been used to create a faux trapunto effect. Quilted freehand on a longarm quilting machine.

209. Jessie Hosie Sutherland, NSW "Mulberry Medallion" 175 x 175 cm Pieced Quilt, predominantly machine guilted -Ámateur

My first medallion guilt in my own design and partly made in classes with Michelle Marvig. It was a challenge and some original ideas needed to be reconsidered as the quilt developed - and grew to be larger than planned.

These colourful wedges remind me of fish floating with the ripples while swimming among the corals on the sea floor. Quilting lines are reflective of the random water movement with knots on top as my trademark.

211 Anita Brown Granville, NSW "Once Was Sarong 4" 174 x 174 cm Pieced Quilt, predominantly machine guilted -

Ámateur

This is part of a series of guilt patterns using a sarong as a starting point. This time I have used a sarong with a floral centre panel and hand dyed fabric that Denise Fagan and I made to complement this design. Machine and hand quilted.


