Kathy Douahty

Kathy Doughty is a self-taught auilter, author, fabric designer and the owner of Material Obsession, a patchwork shop in Sydney, Australia, since 2003, Working with customers. teachers and industry leaders has provided a unique skill base and an eclectic style. "When surrounded by supportive, generous, creative people it is easy to feel that new direction is the norm," she says.

Kathy teaches workshops at Material Obsession, around Australia and internationally. Her workshops focus on tips and techniques for creating interesting combinations of fabrics and often include templates for easy cutting. Her books are written based on experiences she has working directly with guilters including Material Obsession (one and two). Making Quilts. Adding Layers and Mixing Quilt Elements, Her latest book Organic Applique was released in April 2019 with C&T Publishina.

Kathy designs fabric for FreeSpirit Fabrics joining the team in 2015. Her first two ranges, A Wandering Mind and Trail Blazing were designed and produced for the Australian market by Leuteneger. Her collections include Flock Together, Folk Art Revolution, Celebrate and Horizons Fabric, with Seeds and Stems in 2019. The collections bring to life imaginative drawings of her surrounds in a format designed to be used in guilts. Medallions, borders, sashina, backgrounds and fussy cutting elements are all considered. The colour palettes bridge traditional and more contemporary trends.

In 2006 I met Kaffe Fassett and he suggested I acquire a book, Quilts of Illusion by Laura Fisher. I have been inspired by photographs of quilts in this book ever since as patterns appear and shift based on different contrast elements. Honeycomb is an interpretation of a guilt titled Milky Way in this book. I saw the photo, considered the construction and got busy with some scraps and my new fabric collection. Seeds & Stems. Now when I look at the original mine looks very different! I made the quilt for my Taking Shapes workshop using 60 degree shapes, some scraps. There is something most gratifying about designing the fabrics for front and back as well as the quilt! Feel free to join me for workshops that are designed to bring out the creative spirit in guilters!

Stephanie Marauerite Knudsen

After living in Indonesia for five years and immersing myself in the fabric scene and collecting a wide range of local fabrics, I needed to find a use for them and so after I moved to Canberra in 1991 I joined Canberra Quilters and there developed my basic skills through local tutors and workshops.

In Sydney, I joined the Quilters' Guild of NSW Inc. now Quilt NSW. On moving to Perth, WA in 2006, my first priority was to join The West Australian Quilters' Association. WAQA. and meet like-minded people equally passionate about their art. While in Perth a group of friends formed WA Inspired Art Quilters in 2014, the group creates to a WA theme art textile pieces and exhibits and sells throughout Australia and New Zealand.

Living in Western Australia presented never ending inspiration from the landscape and amazing colours of this vast state. I have been working with textiles for over 28 years and lean towards the abstract and innovative rather than pictorial or realistic. The cottons, wool, silks, paper and threads I use in my work are dyed using natural as well as procion, sun dyes and

inks. Many of the fabrics I use are recycled, then treated further with paint, screen printing, stamping and discharging to create an individual piece. I create hangings from these fabrics both by hand and machine, using thread, and found objects for embellishment.

My work uses hand dyed cotton and silk fabrics that are then heavily stitched into and manipulated to create mini landscapes and gerial views of the country. I belonged to several textile groups in Perth WA and exhibit regularly through these groups and as an

Moving back to Sydney in 2017 I was again active with Quilt NSW and attended Judging Day as a helper for two years. Now resident in Mornington Victoria after another move in August 2018. I have joined the Mornington Peninsular Patchworkers and the Embroiderer's Guild of Victoria which has an active patchwork group.

Jenny Rofe

Some of my earliest memories are of times spent with my grandmother, and my mother, learning how to sew. I can't remember not sewing.

My embroidery journey began while I was a teenager. My first quilts were made in the "wagga" style over 40 years ago, just like the guilts on the beds at my grandmother's house. During the 1980s and early 1990s, my husband's work had our family moving around Australia, never settling anywhere for long. This gave me exposure to many different people. groups and shops, and helped me to learn more about patchwork.

I have been teaching embroidery, patchwork and guilting in many forms for around 30 vears. Applique has become my favourite technique, and these days, it is almost always combined with embroidery in my quilts. I love needlework history and playing with texture and collage techniques, I am also a passionate gardener, these loves have an impact on many of the designs I create for stitching. As well as teaching, I have written articles and projects for various Australian craft magazines.

I have been a member of Quilt NSW and the Embroiderers' Guild of NSW since the early 1990s and am very involved with patchwork and embroidery groups in my local area. I have been an accredited tutor with the Embroiderers' Guild since 2000.

Reflections of Eden: (212cm x 212cm)

"Now the Lord God had planted a garden in the east, in Eden." Gen. 2:8. My design for this quilt was influenced by my love of traditional Elizabethan and Jacobean embroidery designs.

Brenda Gael Smith, Copacabana, NSW

Artist, teacher, curator, author, judge, mentor

Brenda Gael Smith creates textile paintings and sketches made from a rich palette of her hand-dyed fabrics complemented by extensive, textural stitching. Much of her work is inspired by the colour and patterns of the natural world. Using a process of abstraction, she captures the essence of her subjects in simplified form. Working improvisationally, she refines line, shape, colour and texture to evoke a sense of place, express an idea, highlight an issue or elicit an emotional response.

Daily walks are a creative habit integral to Brenda's studio practice. By closely observing her surroundings, and taking hundreds of photos, she has a bountiful inspiration bank that informs her work. From the dye pot, to the design wall, to the sewing machine, she also embraces the serendipity factor.

Catherine Butterworth

Born and raised in the state of Ohio in the USA, Catherine comes from a family of seamstresses and quilt makers. As a trained Fashion Teacher and owner of The Fabric Shop in Chatswood, NSW for 28 years, Catherine has extensive experience and knowledge of fabrics.

Since retiring in 2005 Catherine has concentrated on her quilt making resulting in numerous awards both in Australia and overseas. In quilt making Catherine is known for her use of colour, her stunning fabric choices, her signature fussy cutting, her precise piecing and her overall attention to detail.

1. Painted Magnolia, 2018, 170cm x 170cm

I was inspired by a weaving design in "A Handweaver's Source Book" c1950. I adapted part of the original two toned Magnolia graph into this quilt, 'painting it' with some of my favourite colours and adding a few circles just for fun.

I fell in love with the result of fussy cutting the centre cream motif. From there I simply worked my way from the Feathered Star outward. At every stage it was the beautiful fabric prints that dictated the final design.

I was inspired by a weaving design for fourharness overshot patterns in "A Handweaver's Source Book". To add dimension to the original two toned pattern I recoloured various elements to feature the traditional Nine Patch quilt block.

4. Flowering Star, 2016, 226cm x 226cm

It all started with a fussy cut floral star and grew into the traditional broken star quilt layout. The strong rich colours remind me of the colours my Mother used to decorate our family home.

Although the traditional Seven Sisters block is not as old as other blocks, it has stood the test of time. In order to showcase my contemporary fabrics I have replaced diamonds with triangles & hexagons while maintaining the original silhouette.

6. Carnaby Street, 2015, 225cm x 225cm

I am fascinated with the seemingly endless design possibilities of the kaleidoscope grid. The quilt interior and the pieced borders incorporate some variation of this versatile block. The Carnaby Street fabric range features in the centre motif.

7. **Sisterhood**, 2013, 220cm x 240cm

I am drawn to traditionally pieced quilt blocks and I adore the effects achieved by fussy cutting interesting prints. When I couldn't find a suitable fabric for the sashing, I designed a pieced sashing which involved appliquéing 510 circles.

8. For my Darling Daughter Julie, 2012, 245cm x 245cm

When asked what kind of quilt Julie would like for her 21st Birthday she replied "something traditional Mom, and leave enough room for quilting". Note to self, next time ask for Julie's definition of traditional!

9. Stars and Roses, 2012, 238cm x 238cm

Retirement means I have the luxury of 'playing' in my sewing room. This quilt started with the light pink and white motif from my stash and finished with the outer border purchased while visiting our daughter in NYC.

10. Googly Eyes, 2011, 195cm x 245cm

I started fussy cutting stars from my stash, then the quilt took on a life all its own as often happens. The name "Googly Eyes" refers to the fabric used in the sashing stars.

11. **Hexagon Stars for Ulladulla,** 2011, 173cm x 188cm

This quilt is the result of being asked to teach at a quilt retreat in Ulladulla. I was asked to illustrate a variety of both simple and more complicated pieced hexagon stars.

- Community Quilts will be focusing on the assembly, quilting and binding of the quilts they
 make for others.

30. Noonan, Prunella Avalon, NSW "Looking Back" 33 x 46cm Pictorial Quilt

Looking back at Earth from further out in space, our wonderful blue planet.

31. Wood, Katherine Kirrawee NSW "Fungi" 20 x 30cm

Pictorial Quilt Depiction of fungi often observed on the forest floor in the Barrington Tops National Park. A variety of techniques and materials have been used including cotton, net, polyester and glass beads.

32. Steele, Linda Park Orchards, VIC "Autumn Dance" 43 x 43cm Miniature

I was inspired to make a miniature guilt with some pomegranate shapes that I had been drawing, when I had finished the pattern reminded me of a dance.

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33. Scott. Felicity Miranda NSW "Pineapples & Pears" 43 x 43cm

Miniature

Entirely handmade using traditional Boutris de Provence technique. The design is stitched through two layers of fabric then each individual shape/channel stuffed or corded from back of quilt. Very time consuming but utterly absorbing. Try it!

The movement of sunlight on waves, seaweed and fish creates a marvelous dance of light and shade. This miniature is silk screened with resist on cotton fabric. Appliquéd block prints with autta, dve paint and auilted sheer complete the work.

Miniature I created this quilt in response to a challenge, I decided on the placement of the feathers, guilted it first, then appliqued the feathers on last, I loved doing the auiltina!

Starcrazy showcases what I call quilted trapunto. This is where some elements of the stars are quilted, then padded before the guilt is sandwiched. This technique allows for detailed guilting while still maintaining some loft in the finished quilt.

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
