# Sydney Quilt Show 2023 Judges

## Anna Brown

A graduate of Sydney College of the Arts, Anna embraced quilt making in the early 80's after a four year stay in the USA.

Anna joined the NSW Quilters' Guild on her return to Australia and was Exhibition Secretary in 1989. From 1991 to 1995 was joint co-ordinator of The New Quilt Exhibition with Judy Hooworth and juried The New Quilt in 1997 and 2021.

Anna has exhibited extensively internationally, including Quilt National, (4 times) and Quilt=Art=Art in the USA., the Festival of Quilts, UK; Carrefour Europeen du Patchwork and Quilt Expo en Beaujolais in France. Nationally, exhibitions include Art Quilt Australia; Expressions-The Wool Quilt Prize; The New Quilt and Dare to Differ.

Her work is in private and public collections here and overseas.

Anna continues to create art quilts from her homebased studio in Bungwahl NSW.

### **Canopy 19**

**137cms x 156cms**

This quilt is part of a series studying the canopy of the bush near my home. I work directly with cotton and linen fabric, cutting and layering intuitively. Raw edge machine applique, and hand quilted.

## Jill Christian

Quilting for me started in 2000. I enjoy learning and trying different techniques and have made many quilts involving different techniques of applique, traditional and contemporary piecing and paper piecing, art and pictorial quilts. Some of these have been my own design, and others have been done in workshops to learn new skills.

I have been teaching a quilting group for a number of years and have taught a few workshops to groups, and for the SA Quilters.

From 2009 to 2014 I was on the Festival of Quilts committee and became Judging Panel Coordinator since May 2016, having been a member of the Judging Panel from 2013. Since then, judging local and rural shows, our guild exhibition several times, the Royal Adelaide Show and major exhibitions interstate.

I have won many awards for my quilts, although since being involved with judging has meant that I haven't entered quilts in more recent years.

### **My Backyard**

**46cms x 46cms**

Made for an "Inspired by Nature" challenge. Hand dyed and some commercial cotton fabrics, some wool fabrics and felt. Hand and machine Applique used to explore texture and dimension. Embellished with hand embroidery. Machine quilted.

## Chris Jurd

I live in the Blue Mountains outside Sydney and have been quilting for nearly 40 years.

I have a busy schedule of classes throughout the year at various shops in Sydney, regional NSW and interstate.

I have been on the faculty for New Zealand's Quilt Symposium three times and have completed five years as Membership Secretary of QuiltNSW, Australia's largest quilting guild.

I am also a member of QuiltNSW's Judging Education Program.

My work encompasses all styles with an emphasis on a strong colour palette and a preference at the moment for foundation piecing. I have been a regular contributor to Quilters Companion magazine and have recorded two DVDs for the magazine.

Recently I was lucky enough to have a book published with the Quiltmania team.

As tour leader, I've taken two enthusiastic group of Aussie quilters to Houston and another group on a fabulous tour to India in 2019.

**155cms x 155cms**

Made during the pandemic lockdown. I had so much sewing time that it was a great period for designing new quilts. Foundation pieced " "virus" " blocks made using my favourite African fabrics."

# Special Exhibitors

## Susanne Cody

What started out as a hobby has become a lifelong passion. From those first few fabrics purchased at The Strawberry Patch, Hawaii in 1977, I could not have imagined the journey that would follow - full of colour, creativity, inspiration, history and above all else friendship.

For ten years I had the privilege of working at Peppergreen, an antique shop in the town of Berrima.

With its floor to ceiling walls of quilts I was in my element. It was here that I truly learnt my craft. I worked on vintage textiles, mixing old and new to give my work a contemporary look. I honed my skills of fussy cutting, of colour selection and developed new techniques to make the process not only a creative expression of self but an immensely enjoyable one.

It is with this front of mind I am honoured and happy to share my work with you at The Sydney Quilt Show 2023.

### 1 "Gathered-1"

164 x 175 cms

It was the size of the "gathered" fabrics that dictated the layout of this quilt. It is fully reversible with larger pieces of shibori on the back.

The middle layer is voile and it's quilted with sashiko thread - a joy to stitch.

### 2 "Gathered-2"

155 x 178 cms

Threads "gathered" over many years, a collection of African fabrics and Art Gallery solids all came together in this "quilt as you go" Kantha.

Again an absolute joy to make.

### 3 "Gathered-3"

51 x 51 cms

From toddler to teen, from young mum to now, this little piece is a collection of our clothing labels.

The centre panel was a Mother's Day present from my daughter when she was 12.

On the back are crinoline ladies crocheted by my aunt (Olly).

### 4 "Love-a-love Australia"

145 x 145 cms

As bushfires charred our wonderful land, I felt compelled to look for the positives - to see communities coming together in support, to see courage in adversity, to see kindness, compassion and a generosity of spirit to those in greatest need.

### 5 "Sanctuary"

132 x 169 cms

Again seeking positives, this quilt came out of the Covid pandemic.

Throughout it all I felt safe in my "island home" "girt by sea". Our geographic isolation was a positive.

Iconic images worked in my trademark clear brights.

### 6 "Flora and Fauna - a tribute to MJ Hannaford"

154 x 184 cms

Inspired by the Mary Jane Hannaford quilts held at the National of Australia.

With its distinctly Australian theme, this quilt features native birds, waratahs, wattle, spinifex, callistemon, and hakeas.

Our island home girt by sea.

### 7 "Follywood"

175 x 175 cms

Indulging my passion for exotic textiles, this lively Indian wedding quilt is a celebration of life.

### 8 "Woodhouseleigh"

192 x 218 cms

A melting pot of vintage inspiration - this quilt was worked in traditional colours and was my first foray into fussy cutting.

### 9 "Nestle and Vine"

230 x 233 cms

This quilt is a joyous celebration of colour, of fussy cutting and design, of balance and proportion.

It started with the border and a total of 3,980 5/8" hexagons. The centre was designed in response to the unique border.

## 10 "Harriot - Journey to Now"

200 x 220 cms

For me the joy of "old bones" is to bring new life to them. Bright vibrant colours are bedded into a hand loomed European linen sheet.

The middle layer is voile and it's entirely hand made.

## 11 "Storybook"

200 x 240 cms

Like the pages of a book each hexagon frame tells a story.

Storybook features precious textiles gathered over many years.

Making the frames was fun but sewing them to a thick linen sheet had its challenges.

## 12 "Les Toiles"

210 x 210 cms

This coverlet was a labour of love.

Again working on a thick linen sheet, it had its challenges but proved to be an ideal canvas to showcase a collection of toiles and vintage textiles.

## 13 "Sweet Surrender"

165 x 175 cms

Did I say "no more hexagons"? Oh well, perhaps a few hexagon rosettes - such a Sweet Surrender.

Time honoured traditional techniques brought to life with today's fabrics.

## 14 "Kaleidoscope Eyes"

188 x 190 cms

The humble hexagon taken to another level.

The gathering of fabrics for this quilt was definitely not a chore - but the stitching together, well that took about three years. A nice slow stitch and an enjoyable journey.

## 15 "Bride and Bloom"

196 x 196 cms

This quilt is a "marriage" of old and new - the Bird of Paradise quilt top was the catalyst for this piece.

Each of the 780 hexagons is a different fabric and I was able to indulge my love of appliqué and hand piecing.

# Barbara Gower

Barbara grew up in a home where sewing and creativity was encouraged from an early age. Her first English piecing was done in 1975 and she joined the Sydney Quilters Guild in 1988 where she attended many workshops. She has exhibited in most exhibitions since 1991 and has received many awards.

Trained as a primary teacher, Barbara has taught classes and workshops at Evening Colleges, shops, groups and privately.

After completing the Commercial Needlework Course at TAFE in 1995, she became more creative and began to produce textile art works.

Barbara enjoys designing and making textile works from traditional to contemporary, using vintage kimono, particularly silks. Inspiration comes from Japanese culture and textiles and her environment. She mixes hand and machine techniques using fabric, thread, papers and paint.

Currently Barbara is a member of QuiltNSW, The Macarthur Textile Network and a Life Member of Camden Country Quilters Guild.

## 1 "Dreaming of Japan During Lockdown - 2022"

121 x 143 cms

A cancelled trip to Japan because of the pandemic left me dreaming of the mountainous villages we were to visit.

Materials include vintage kimono silk, cotton and wool, stitched and embroidered with variegated Perle threads.

## 2 "Rain, a Double Edged Sword - 2022"

90 x 132 cms

The sound of rain on parched earth brings joy. But relentless rain on saturated ground turns joy to alarm and concern for the consequences.

Materials include organza, vintage cotton, silk and wool kimono. Hand stitched with Perle threads and beaded.

## 3 "Memories That Inspire - The Aunts - 2021"

89 x 110 cms

My maternal aunts were both skilled and creative stitchers with antique textiles, blue and white china, evening and bridal wear to inspire me.

Includes antique kimono linings, hand printed silk, found doilies, buttons and hand stitched.

## 4 "Memories That Inspire - Remembering Mum - 2021"

131 x 154 cms

I have fond memories of mum's kimono dressing gown. She taught me dressmaking, embroidery, patchwork and stitching for enjoyment.

Includes Japanese hemp, organza, silk, hand stitched with cotton and metallic threads using the Korean Bojagi technique.

## 5 "COVID Kimono - 2020"

90 x 103 cms

COVID restrictions caught me off guard and being creative was hard when there was so much time. The grey reminded me of images we were constantly seeing. The Meisen silk represents our world being turned upside down.

Machine pieced and handstitched.

## 6 "Then Came the Rain - 2020"

107 x 136 cms

After fire ravaged our local area the rains finally came. Regeneration slowly began till blackened tree trunks were seen in a sea of greens. The resilience of the bush is amazing.

Old kimono silks, cottons, and wools, machine pieced and quilted.

## 7 "Golden Ginkgo - 2011"

202 x 230 cms

Inspired by the ancient Ginkgo, this original block depicts it's autumn colours. The bare painted tree shows the ginkgo's strength as a survivor. Machine pieced cottons, machine quilted in metallic thread, hand painted

## 8 "Natural Forces - 2019"

35 x 164 cms

As the wind and water erode our shoreline, patterns and colours are revealed in all their glory creating wonderful inspiration.

Hand dyed silk, layered with felt and tea dyed silk organza. Stitched and beaded by hand and machine.

### 9 "Wholecloth Strippy - 2019"

154 x 122 cms

To recreate this old silk kimono was time consuming but a joy. It just needed simple stitching in its original narrow widths to show the beauty of its design.

Stitched by hand and joined by machine.

### 10 "The Boro Coat - 2018"

48 x 94 cms

An old Japanese Haori (jacket) repaired and remade already, needed more mending. Taking it apart, it was stitched onto wool felt adding pieces where necessary and creating a new coat.

Vintage kimono silk, stitched with cottons.

### 11 "Kyoto by Night - 2018"

98 x 151 cms

After a trip to Japan, the memory of lanterns hanging outside restaurants and a traditional Japanese Lantern block inspired this quilt. Using vintage Kimono silks collected in Japan was a joy.

Machine pieced, hand stitched and quilted.

### 12 "Wongs of Hope - 2017"

133 x 156 cms

The skill of the Japanese Ikat weavers continues to inspire my work. The beauty of these old Kimono Meisen silks deserve to be given a new purpose and life. It is a privilege to stitch with them.

Machine pieced and hand quilted.

### 13 "Arigato Art Deco - 2016"

115 x 139 cms

Remnants of vintage Kimono Meisen silks cannot be wasted! Here they are used to create a new Kimono wall hanging.

Hand stitched and quilted.

### 14 "Timely Changes - 2016"

52 x 117 cms

The old Japanese paper begun its life as scraps and used as stiffening for a bag. They now reflect my respect for the ordinary, imperfect things in life and the joy they can give if we look for it.

Papers, kimono silk and organza. Hand stitched.

### 15 "Sometimes Fabric Just Sings - 2015"

165 x 195 cms

Meisen silks were popular in the 30s and 40s as Kimono for fashionable Japanese ladies. My collection of these vintage fabrics needed a simple block to show their wonderful designs.

Hand appliqued and embroidered, machine pieced and quilted.

*Blue and White*

1930s

Quilt top from the 1930s that has been given a second life – finished with big Stitch Quilting

### 3 Star Quilt

*Multicolour*

1930s

1930s star quilt blocks. The blocks were stained and worn indicating they had been in another quilt. The blocks were then reassembled to create a new quilt. Hand quilted

### 4 Double Wedding Ring

*Multicolour*

1930s

This quilt was given to a young boy when he moved from Australia to Seattle in Washington USA in 1946. Maker unknown. Returning to Australia in 1951 the quilt held happy memories for him. Unfortunately, his family did not want the quilt and sold it in 1998.

### 5 9 Patch

*Multi Colour*

1940s

I purchased a bundle of assorted sized blocks in an antique shop in Missouri USA in 2018. The fabrics date from the late 1800(dark blue) to 1940's I trimmed the blocks to one size, added the yellow borders and used floral fabric from my stash for the intersection blocks and binding. The floral fabric was my grandmother's from the 1940s.

### 6 Devils Claw

*Blue/Brown/Cream*

Civil War

Quilt purchased from Paducah USA in 2007. The fabrics are from the Civil War Period 1860s. Still in excellent condition.

### 7 Untitled

*Blue/Multi*

1950s

This quilt was made by the patients at Broughton Hall, a mental health facility.

### 8 Signature Quilt

*Red and White*

1910-1920

Signature quilts were popular around 1910. Used as fundraising events where people paid to have their name embroidered on a quilt. From the USA but no identification or date other than the reference 'Albert Street Presbyterian Church'

### 9 Star Quilt

*Pink/Brown*

1870

From Pennsylvania USA this quilt is a beautiful example of hand quilting. There is some deterioration of the brown and pink fabrics.

### 10 Lone Star

*Multi coloured*

1920-30'

Feed Sacks used to create this Lone Star Quilt. The top was purchase in 2019. The quilt top was damaged, and areas repaired before machine quilting and binding applied.

### 11 Northumberland Quilt

*Blue*

1930

The quilting design is the 'deep fan' or 'cockle shell' motif which surrounds the central medallion. The fact that this shell design prevails in this quilt could be because of its coastal origins.

### 12 Weardale Quilt?

*White*

1900

This quilt possibly from Weardale in County Durham displays a range of traditional Durham quilting designs on 12 vertical columns.

### 13 Welsh Pieced Quilt

*Pink/blue/white*

1900

Although this is a frame design quilt, the quilting does not follow the frames. It almost looks as though the pieced side is the back!

### 14 Durham Quilt

*Green or Pink*

1920s

Doubled sided quilt, green and cream on one side and pink and cream on the other side.

Quilted in Trail and Diamond patterns. The central panel is quilted with feather circlets surrounding a central medallion.

### 15 Red Baskets

*Red and white*

1880-1900

I bought some old red and white basket blocks on eBay. They were taken out of an old quilt and were in poor condition. I replaced the white in some of the blocks with similar old fabric. Then bordered each block with white to bring them up to the same size. Put together with modern red solid fabric and hand quilted. There are still some stains on some of the older fabrics. A sign of wear!

**16 Log Cabin****Multicolour****Uncertain**

Each quilt-as-you-go block is approximately 7" and is machine foundation pieced, then the outer logs turned to the back and hand stitched. Then the blocks are hand stitched together - it has been well used and has some damage

The exact provenance is unknown - assume it's English in origin. I bought it at Peppergreen Antiques.

The owners - Carina and Robert Cox used to go to England on annual buying trips where they purchased all manner of antiques. Carina had a good eye and bought well.

I purchased it approximately 2012

**17 Suffolk Puff****Multicolour****1942-1945**

Made by Mrs W. G. Moodie between 1942 - 1945.

It is mostly made from scraps from the clothes of her daughter Mrs Ailsa Daniels and also scraps of fabric from her friends.

The solid colour fabric dividing the Suffolk puffs was purchased for this quilt.

**18 The Stephenson Quilt****Ivory and Gold****1916**

Wholecloth quilt made by one of the last five hand quilters in England, Mrs Stephenson of Binchester, between Bishop Auckland and Durham City. The quilt was completed in 1916. Made of ivory and gold Italian Satin, featuring an original feather design.

**19 4 Pointed Star****Multi coloured****Circa 1920**

Hand sewn quilt given to me by my mother-in-law, Toni Rustebakke, in 1980. It came from Texas where she previously lived.

**20 Suffolk Puff****Circa 1940**

The quilt was found when removing rubbish from a deceased estate. Maker unknown

*Owned by Angela Klassen*

**21 Flying Geese****Red and White****Circa 1910**

This quilt top from Michigan State USA. Turkey red with small black and white spot shirting

**22 Silk Hexagon Quilt****Multicolour****Circa 1880**

Quilt attributed to Millicent Anne Cox.

Found in a trunk in the shearers' quarters at "Newstead South", Elmore, about 1970. The matching workbag was identified as being made by Millicent by her daughter, Mary Constance, who was married to John Archibald Anderson and lived at "Newstead" for many years, so the quilt has also been attributed to Millicent.

The quilt has been dated to about 1880 and is made of silks, brocades and velvets. Several of the fabrics are repeated in different colours so they appear to have been samples.

In 1879 Millicent, her husband, Edward King Cox and daughter, Mary, went on a tour of Europe. Close examination shows that two people worked on the quilt and it is possible that it was worked while they were travelling.

It is backed with machine quilted satin, and we have an account from Lukey, Vaughan and Co (London) which lists a piece of crimson quilted satin, although not a large enough piece for the quilt backing.

**23 Crinoline Girl and Top Hat Boy****Peach and Green,****Circa 1930-1940**

Multiple repeated shapes used regularly in patchwork constructed with solid fabrics and then 'engineered' to fit together in a pleasing way.

I just love the precision of curved piecing! As I experimented with various layouts for this series of drunkards path blocks a somewhat psychedelic "S O S" revealed itself in my hand-dyed fabrics, hence the decision to arrange them as a triptych.

**"Baby Blue"** 80 x 93 cms  
 Modern - Improvisational

'Baby Blue' is an indigo dyed, machine pieced, hand quilted, hand painted appliqué patch quilt made from repurposed fabrics (old cotton/canvas tote bags, calico scraps, old cotton sheets). It has four tabs at the top for a dowel rod for display.

**11. Harding, Julie** Toormina NSW  
**"Dream Interrupted"** 89 x 88 cms  
 Modern - Traditional

Inspired by the aboriginal design and colours of the fabric. A drunkards path block of varying scale is used then sliced and pieced, creating asymmetry. Appliqué circles appear to be floating like an interrupted dream.

**12. Law, Michelle** Downer ACT  
**"Caps"** 50 x 50 cms  
 Modern - Negative Space and Minimal Design

The small folded-edge appliqué circles are attached to the final quilt with matchstick quilting. The effect reminds me of colourful bottle caps. Made for the 2022 Braidwood Quilt Event fabric challenge.

**"A Time To Dance"** 75 x 55 cms  
 Modern - Negative Space and Minimal Design

I took Brenda Gael Smith's online workshop, "Riffing with Repetition", learning heaps about repeating motifs in design. An original design flowing from the experience. It was great to learn the theory and to also see what other participants created.

**"Connection"** 135 x 67 cms  
 Modern - Improvisational

Constructed entirely with improvisational piecing, Connection represents family as individuals and as a whole; unique yet cohesive. The individual beads have been crumb pieced and the quilt is finished with echo quilting.

**"Bushfire"** 72 x 76 cms  
 Modern - Improvisational

Improvised piecing that provided some experimenting with the fabrics and created a finished piece that reminds me of a bushfire.

- Dry, dusty, perhaps a hint of moisture in places, this piece reminds me of a riverbed with rocks, sand and stringy branches hanging down.

**"Trig Point 5429"** **130 x 130 cms**  
**Modern - Improvisational**
- A trig point is a reference point on high ground used in surveying. Taree's trig point is on Breakneck Lookout and overlooks the Manning Valley. The map of the valley and river system is couched over the piecing.

**"Hexagon Riffing"** **155 x 125 cms**  
**Modern - Traditional**




