

One of many antique quilts that I love to replicate. It contains 3,012 triangles. Machine pieced and hand quilted. It was awarded the Creative Use of Colour Award in 2012.

The placement of triangles makes the eye move continually around the quilt.

Embellishing the Surface is Caroline's way of creating textures that are interesting and change the way You as the viewer look at fabric.

Stitching into the surface gives her a changing palette and adding colours brings the artwork to life.

In Caroline's art practise her approach is to chop the fabrics into small confetti styled pieces, and then mix the colours and textures to create beautiful new fabrics. She uses raw edge applique and thread painting to enhance these surfaces.

Caroline travels to teach her techniques of fabric embellishments and textured surface workshops and loves to inspire and encourage everyone to experience the creative side of Textile Art.

Caroline's publishes the online magazine The Digital Cloth and also hosts Sewing Up a Storm Retreats Australia wide.



'Tropical Colours'

Open to all fibre, thread & textile Artists. The Art prize accepted entries representing any use of fibre, threads & textiles and encouraged the artist to explore art quilting and textile art practices.

The inspiration for each quilt can be found in many places; a tropical reef, tropical colours loved by the maker, a tropical food or place.

Special Exhibitors



The Colours of Australia quilt tour was commenced in 1995 as a forum to show the directions in Australian quiltmaking. The following excerpt from the book "Colours of Australia - Directions in Quilt Making"

'Colour is the single most striking feature of Australian quilts; their strength of colour, range of hues, and exciting combinations set them apart from quilts from other countries. The theme, Colours of Australia, was intended to provide a wide spectrum of possible interpretations that embody colours and symbolism that are uniquely Australian.'

QuiltNSW invited quiltmakers to interpret the theme of the Colours of Australia using traditional or contemporary techniques. 170 quiltmakers from around Australia, New Zealand, and the United Kingdom submitted quilts, of which 40 were selected and purchased by the Quilters Guild of NSW for a 5-year nationwide tour and book.

The Arts Council of Australia arranged for four self-contained exhibitions of ten quilts to travel Australia. They were exhibited in public foyers, shopping centres, libraries, civic spaces, and schools nationwide. It is estimated that several hundred thousand people have viewed the exhibitions, and they are on display again for your enjoyment at this year's Sydney Quilt Show.

The collection toured throughout Australia from 1995 until 1999, serving as a platform to show the direction of Australian quilt-making. It is estimated the exhibitions were viewed by several hundred thousand people. This Quilt Collection is as relevant today as it was 30 years ago, a testament to the skill of its makers as 2024 is the 30th anniversary of the Colours of Australia collection this is an appropriate time to display them again f or your enjoyment at this year's Sydney Quilt Show.

Blackened Beauty

The January bushfires in 1994 had a tremendous impact on people's lives. Newspapers emphasised the sensational rather than the effect on people's lives. My quilt develops these ideas and my reactions to such insensitivity.

Materials: cotton, acetate, polyester, silk-screened printed cotton

Techniques: machine-piecing, free form machine appliqué, machine embroidery, hand quilting

Just Leaves

Outside my window is a beautiful tree. As the golden sunlight shines through its leaves, it echoes the colours of the nearby bushland. To capture the great variety of greens and golds I discovered as I studied my tree, I used over 150 fabrics in 450 appliquéd leaves.

Materials: cotton, polyester batting

Techniques: hand appliqué, hand piecing

From a Distance

Kerry Gadd

My starting point in this quilt is yellow, the colour of the desert. It provides the contrast for all the other colours, brightening and highlighting as it interacts with the greens and blues of the fertile areas and the blue of the ocean. Hints of red move through the colours, suggesting heat.

Materials: cotton, pellon batting

Techniques: machine piecing onto a foundation, tying

Urban Landscape

Judy Hooworth

The effect of human intervention on the landscape interests me. The bright colours and graphic patterning of the paraphernalia associated with the road and sewerage works in my suburb offer a continuing source of inspiration.

Materials: cotton, pellon, batting (doubled)

Techniques: machine piecing, machine appliqué, applied crayons, hand quilting, machine quilting

Convicts & Soldiers - First Settlement 125 x 90

Val Nadin

The traditional 'Beggar's Block' provides the basis for my quilt although the traditional form has been changed and distorted. I have employed considerable symbolism in my choice of materials and colour, using black and white stripes, arrows and sacking to suggest the clothing of convicts of the early European settlement. The jackets and crossed bandoliers of the soldiers are represented by the colours red and white, while the use of silk hints at military decorations.

Materials: silk, sacking, cotton, polyester

Techniques: machine piecing, machine quilting

Queensland's Blue Lightning90 x 125

Larraine Scouler

I am fascinated by the colours in the boulder opals found in Queensland. These poor cousins of the more popular opal reveal a brilliant blue, contrasting with a subdued brown from the surrounding rock.

Materials: cotton, polyester, satin, polyester batting

Techniques: machine piecing, machine quilting

Forest III 125 x 90

Joy Serwylo

The colours deep within the Dandenong Ranges in Victoria where I live are not the greens of first glance, but a myriad of greens, oranges, pinks and browns. Inspired by these colours, I am compelled to move away from my love of the lifeordering quality of the traditional quilt, and to paint and draw with fabrics to capture the magic.

Materials: cotton, polycotton, hand-dyed and printed cotton

Techniques: collage secured by free-motion quilting

Country Colours	90 x 125
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Merle Thatcher

My home in central Victoria is surrounded by tall gums and lovely wattle, with many varieties of birds and Australian fauna. This quilt expresses my love of the country, the beauty of everything Australian. Uluru, an essential part of any Australian landscape, is central to the design.

Materials: cotton, polycotton, dyed and bleached fabrics

Techniques: hand pieced, appliqué, embroidery, hand quilting

Red Rock - Uluru	90 x 125

Sue Wademan

The red rock dominates my quilt, reflecting my view that this landmark must be preserved and protected for future generations. Shimmering images are part of the desert landscape.

Materials: silk, hand printed fabric from the Tiwi tribe, antique beads, brocades, chiffon

Techniques: strip piecing, free machine embroidery, machine quilting, layering, collage

Crabs & Mangroves

Pam Winsen

"Crabs and Mangroves" is my gentle reminder of the importance of our littoral areas and the beauty we must all strive to preserve. I enjoyed investigating this design, changing its orientation, size and interaction many times before actually committing it to fabric.

Materials: hand dyed cotton, chiffon

Techniques: machine piecing, raw edge applique, machine embroidery

Rhythm of the Reef

Elizabeth Bren

The Great Barrier Reef, with its varied depths of colour, banded reefs, swirling surf and dappled shallows, shows a quilt like quality in aerial photography. My quilt reflects this, capturing the feel of the reef from the sky. I introduced new textures and techniques to my work, gaining inspiration from the textured fabrics in a mother-of-the-bride dress from a secondhand clothing shop, and succeeded in taming various shades of aqua satins and synthetics for my complex curved piecing design.

Materials: cotton, synthetics, satin, hand marbeled silk, polyester batting

Techniques: machine piecing, hand quilting, machine quilting

I Was Thinking It Might be a Dust Storm 90 x 125

Helen Brook

My quilt is a representation of the atomic testing carried out by the British Government in the Australian desert at Maralinga: the "Black Mist" disaster. The hot colours of the fireball signify the force of the bomb and also the turmoil felt by the First Nation people as they endured sickness, death and relocation because of the poisoned air and land. The peaceful area, depicting new growth and sunshine is a sign of hope with the news that the British Government has agreed to contribute nearly half of the cost of decontaminating the radioactive waste left at Maralinga. I have recorded on the quilt what the uninformed First Nation people saw and their confusion at the time of the bombing.

Materials: hand dyed cotton

Techniques: machine piecing, machine quilting, machine embroidery

A Land of Volunteers - True Oz Spirit 90 x 125

Dale Brown

Whatever the disaster, man-made or natural, I am always impressed by the availability of volunteers there to "help a mate" in the true Aussie spirit. When the chips are down in drought, floods, fire or cyclone, someone is there to help. My quilt pays tribute to all these volunteers.

Materials: cotton, polycotton, stars, beads

Techniques: strip piecing, reverse applique, applique

Hidden Landscapes

125 x 90

Bronwen Gibbs

Blue and gold in landscapes has long been overlooked as very Australian. Blue sea, yellow sands, golden dry grass in our white summer light all provide this wonderful combination of colour. Dyeing and photocopying with an overlay of the quilting stitch have captured the image of rolling waves and swaying marrum grass.

Materials: hand printed and dyed cotton, cotton batting

Techniques: Gocco printing, machine piecing, machine quilting

Torallie in Bombala 125 x 90

Narelle Grieve

At Bombala in New South Wales is a wonderful old picture theatre. The pressed tin on the walls and ceiling of the building took my breath away. With a penchant for wholecloth quilts, I had to transform those wonderful designs on the tin into a quilt, using stipple quilting at the end to achieve the pressed tin effect.

Materials: synthetic silk, cotton backing, polyester batting

Techniques: Wholecloth work, hand quilting, stipple quilting

Expired Pyre

125 x 90

Wendy Holland

The colours that surrounded me in January 1994 were blacks and browns, greys and deep ochres. Using treasured Italian fabrics, playing subtleties of shade and tone, I have recorded a symbolic personal response to the bushfires rather than a literal interpretation.

Materials: silk, satin, cotton, velvet, mother of pearl buttons, flannelette batting

Techniques: stitching straight on to the backing through the batting

Australia - The Eye of the World is Upon You 125 x 90

Helen Lucy Howe

On a backdrop of colours representing our lifestyle in the sunny outdoors, my quilt includes all of those recognisable icons that are uniquely Australian. With Sydney Olympics 2000 just around the corner, and the world's fascination with our flora and fauna, I was overwhelmed with ideas to include in my design. I chose my favourites, including the First Nations flag in the corners of the quilt, capturing some of the essence of Australia. The world is watching you, Australia, and waits for the year 2000 to unfurl.

Materials: cotton, silk, polyester batting, embroidery threads, Isafil nylon for quilting

Techniques: machine-piecing, machine appliqué, machine embroidery, machine quilting

ANZAC

125 x 90

Margaret Rolfe

On ANZAC Day, Australians as a nation remember the soldiers who landed at Gallipoli in World War I. Frank Rolfe, my husband's father, did return from World War I. This quilt outlines his youthful face on a backdrop of woollen rectangles. My husband wrote his father's story on the back of the quilt.

Materials: woollen and cotton fabrics, wool

Techniques: machine piecing, hand embroidery, machine quilting, tying

Summertime

Politicians in Australia would love our country to be known for its vocation ethic, but I think we have a wonderful vacation ethic instead. My quilt captures memories of many enchanted vacations spent enjoying the sun and celebrating life.

Materials: cotton, polycotton, embroidery thread

Techniques: piecing, appliqué, reverse appliqué, hand quilting

Together in Harmony

Australia is depicted a two women, one First Nation and one of European descent, dancing with their hands linked. They dance together but differently, revealing the variety their cultures bring to Australia as a whole.

Materials: cotton, cotton/polyester batting

Techniques: hand piecing, hand appliqué, machine appliqué, machine quilting

My Ultimate Challenge

So much of Australia's architectural heritage deserves to be celebrated. I have chosen Maryborough Railway Station, surrounding it with wattle, the focus of the Maryborough Wattle Festival, and other wild flowers.

Materials: cotton, Aida cloth, embroidery threads

Techniques: machine piecing, hand appliqué, blackwork

From Today	125 x 90

Sandra Burchill

Some of my fabrics reflect memories of a visit to Sydney in 1993 - a toile, a sailing ship fabric and a rock pattern. These formed the building tool as I constructed my quilt with Captain Phillip as the central figure from the past surrounded by present buildings, and all framed by a golden future, peeling back to the present.

Materials: Australian toile, cotton, lurex

Techniques: machine piecing, machine appliqué, hand appliqué, hand quilting

When I think of Australia's history, I not only think of our First Nation heritage and the First Nation connection with the earth and sky, but also of our English connections, reflected in the potted aspidistras, which are very English and always make me think of Victorian drawing rooms.

Materials: cotton, permanent textile ink, crochet cotton

Techniques: airbrushing, hand quilting

EIW 448

EIW 448 is the number plate of our four-wheel drive which takes us to remote places throughout the outback. I enjoy the images of the outback, their vibrant rich colours and the myths surrounding them. My quilt emerges, reflecting my emotions and innermost feelings - memories of the environment.

Materials: cotton, polycotton

Techniques: habd appliqué, machine appliqué, hand piecing, embroidery

Bush Textures 125 x 90

Wendy Lugg

I like to use my artistic techniques as a means of expressing an idea. To achieve the impression of the changing colours of the Australian bush, I have constructed my quilt using crazy strippiecing, a technique that has evolved as my forest series developed, enhanced, with printing and overprinting.

Materials: cotton, polyester, fabric printing ink

Techniques: machine piecing, machine quilting, hand printing

Flames, Ash, Embers125 x 90

Barbara Macey

My quilt celebrates a narrow escape from a bushfire 25 years ago. My clothes were scorched by red-hot gum leaves carried along by gale force winds. I wanted to create the atmosphere of flames racing through the grass and up the trees, with masses of hot debris flying through the air. The beginning of the fire is captured in the strong red border, with the inner panel representing the ash and embers after the fire had passed.

Materials: cotton, synthetic, hand-printed fabric

Techniques: pressed piecing, machine quilting, fabric printing

Red Earth, Blue Sky

A visitor to Australia, flying over Darwin for the first time, sees vast expanses of red-brown earth and the blue, blue sky. Warmed by the sun and bathes in its light, these images form lasting impressions, captured in my quilt.

Materials: cotton, cotton blend

Techniques: free motion machine quilting

The Years That Were That Should Never Have Been $$125 \times 90$$

So many of my emotions are expressed in this, my first quilt. I was inspired to begin because of my deep feelings for those who served in Vietnam and the recognition of their plight as they fought for acceptance and a place in Australian history.

Materials: cotton, printed cotton, army shirt and badges

Techniques: machine piecing, hand quilting

Parrots in the Trees - Colour and Movement 90 x 125

Wendelee Weis

Eating breakfast each morning, I am surrounded by a riot of noise and colour as the native birds join me. Fighting for space on the feeders, they jostle and argue with each other in a dazzling whirl of colour. I wanted to capture this sensory delight in my quilt, using the black background to highlight my pallet of colour.

Materials: velvet, Dupion silk, satin, silk thread

Techniques: ruching, piecework, appliqué, hand quilting

Origins

Sailing the Whitsunday Passage, I found peace and a revitalisation for my mind and body. My quilt is a collection of my thoughts: of the beauty of the waters contrasting with the earth and the forbidding yet alluring outback.

Materials: silk, polyester, cotton

Techniques: machine piecing, hand quilting

Spring Morning

While overseas, one of the things I missed most was the song of the magpies in the early morning. To me, it is truly the essence of everything Australian: sunshine-filled mornings, the noises of the bush and freedom, the contrast of black and white against the soft tones of the bush.

Materials: cotton

Techniques: machine appliqué, embroidery, machine quilting

NWWA

I made this quilt after a very enjoyable trip to north-western Western Australia, travelling by road through the Kimberleys and the Bungle Bungles to the west coast, Broome and Coral Bay. The quilt shows the red earth, the stripes of the Bungle Bungles and the turquoise sea.

Materials: cotton, polyester batting

Techniques: machine piecing, machine quilting

Hollow Mountain Layers

In the Grampians is the mysterious and haunting Hollow Mountain. I wanted to explore the many facets of this intriguing area with its caves and chasms, rich colours, surreal rock formations and patterns.

Materials: calico, organdie, chintz, cotton

Techniques: hand painting, hand printing, appliqué, machine embroidery, free machine quilting

Under the Big Top

Humour has always been a popular form of political commentary in Australia. Living in Canberra, it is impossible to avoid politics. After our local government banned circus performances, my quilt suggests that our political circus continues to be a showcase of entertainment for the whole nation.

The theme really captured my imagination. I thought about multiculturalism and the different people in our society and, of course, their babies. With real babies as models (photos only), I fashioned my nine little people to rest on pillows, creating a three-dimensional effect.

Materials: cotton, polycotton, lace, cotton batting

Techniques: appliqué, embroidery, painting, soldering silver safety pins

Up...Down...All Around

I am fortunate to live in a national park, surrounded by a marvellous canopy, amazing rock formations and exquisite ground coverings of flowers and grasses.

This quilt evokes the colours of my particular environment the vast blue sky, blue-green mountains, grey rocks and soft pink sandstone.

Materials: hand dyed and painted cotton, silk, corduroy

Techniques: appliqué, machine piecing, machine embroidery, machine quilting

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And See Who Salutes

With a supply of flag bunting and an irrepressible sense of humour, I set about putting my thoughts on banana republics and changing flags together. The quilt works on all levels, with the subtle inclusion of the stars of the Southern Cross only seen at close range, while the banana remains the overriding feature, seen at any distance.

Materials: cotton, gold fabric, flag bunting, wool batting

Techniques: reverse appliqué, machine piecing, dyeing, hand quilting, machine quilting, tying

A quotation from "The Road to Coorain" by Jill Ker Conway, inspired me to capture the essence of Sydney: the beaches, the city buildings, and the vegetation. As I attempted "to let go all the rules" in making the quilt, I found that the use of fraying fabrics allowed the quilt to develop over time and with friction and tension, to change.

Materials: silk, polycotton, cotton

QuiltNSW Members Challenge

A Song Title

QuiltNSW members are challenged each year to make a small quilt based on a theme. The theme for 2023 was "A Song Title".

The quilts must consist of 3 layers and be 40 cm X 40 cm, any construction method and materials can be used.

The Suitcase Challenge quilts are retained by QuiltNSW for 2 years and form a travelling exhibition which is available for groups and organizations to borrow for events and exhibitions.

Junior and Youth Challenge

The purpose of this challenge is to encourage juniors and youth to become involved in the art of patchwork and quilting. The challenge is free to enter and open to both members and non-members.

Entrants may enter one quilt block with no side smaller than 25 cm or larger than 30 cm. There is no limit to the colours, materials, construction methods or designs that may be used. You can use any technique or medium. All quilt blocks must contain a stitched component either by hand, machine, or both. The block may consist of smaller blocks stitched together to create a block that fits within the size restraints. The block is not to include quilting or binding. If the entrant is young, they may have the assistance of an adult to create their entry.

There are 2 categories, Junior (up to year 6) and Youth (year 7 to 12). First, second and third prizes will be awarded for both categories. All prize winners receive a rosette and cash prize.

The Junior & Youth Block Challenge will return in 2025.



The quilt was made to teach the QAYG method and as a way to incorporate machine quilting on a smaller scale. I incorporated several different techniques into the quilt such as EPP, Foundation Piecing, 3D Piecing, 3D Appliqué and some Crazy patchwork.

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
